Moore (Carol) than enough entertainment is planned, so everyone come and end three years of excitement with a great Friday night! See you there!


SPOTLIGHT


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Track



The death-defying Jones Track Team, coached by the mastermind Coach Davidson, has a record of 5 wins and 2 losses in duel and triangular meets and two third place finishes in the Worthington and Gene Cole Relays.

Jones came in 3rd in the open division and 9th in the relays of the very confusing and debatable Gene Cole Relays at Lancaster, Saturday, May 12th. In a comment after the Gene Coles Relays, Coach Davidson said, "We did a good job in an extremely confusing meet." We played such celebrated schools as Hastings, Springfield, Franklin, Dayton Wayne, Mansfield, Johnny Appleseed, Washington Courthouse Blendon, Walnut Springs, Circleville, and New Philadelphia.
